

SRM Joint Entrance Examination – Law (SRMJEEEL)

PATTERN

- The question paper consists of 100 questions with duration of 120 minutes.
- Multiple choice questions carry 1 mark each.
- There is no negative mark for wrong answers.

SYLLABUS

The question paper will have 5 parts with the following topics:

PART 1. English (20 Questions)

Passages of about 450 words will be provided. These passages will be derived from contemporary or historically significant fiction and non-fiction writing, and would be of a standard that a 12th standard student may be able to read in about 5-7 minutes.

Each passage will be followed by a series of questions to test candidate's ability to:

1. Read and comprehend the main point discussed in the passage, as well as any arguments and viewpoints discussed or set out in the passage;
2. Draw inferences and conclusions based on the passage;
3. Summarise the passage;
4. Compare and contrast the different arguments or viewpoints set out in the passage; and
5. Understand the meaning of various words and phrases used in the passage.

PART 2. Legal Aptitude (20 Questions)

To evaluate candidate's skills on

1. General awareness of contemporary legal and moral issues
2. Identify and infer the rules and principles given in the passage.
3. Apply rules and principles to various fact situations
4. Ability to understand how changes to the rules or principles may change their application to various fact situations.

PART 3. Logical Reasoning (20 Questions)

To evaluate the candidate's

1. Ability to identify arguments and their premises and draw conclusions
2. Ability to critically analyse patterns of reasoning, and assess how conclusions may depend on particular premises or evidence
3. Infer what follows from the passage and apply these inferences to new situations
4. Draw relationships and analogies,
5. Identify contradictions and equivalence, and assess the effectiveness of arguments.

PART 4: G.K and Current Affairs. (20 Questions)

To evaluate the candidate's knowledge of

1. Contemporary events of significance from India and the world;
2. Arts and culture;
3. International affairs; and
4. Historical events of continuing significance.

PART 5: Elementary Mathematics. (20 Questions)

To evaluate candidates' knowledge in

1. Arithmetic
2. Commercial Mathematics
3. Mensuration and
4. Modern Mathematics
