O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) is a non-profit, multidisciplinary, and research-oriented university founded in 2009. JGU was established as a philanthropic initiative by its Founding Chancellor, Mr. Naveen Jindal, in memory of his father, Mr. O.P. Jindal.

JGU has over 16,000 students, more than 1,100 full-time faculty members, and over 2,900 administrative staff on its fully residential campus. The university comprises twelve schools focusing on various disciplines, including Law, Business & Management, International Affairs, Public Policy, Liberal Arts & Humanities, Journalism, Design & Architecture, Banking & Finance, Environment & Sustainability, Psychology & Counselling, Languages & Literature, and Public Health & Human Development.

Over the past decade, JGU has evolved into an institution that brings together full-time faculty from more than 50 countries, students from over 100 countries, and collaborations with more than 575 leading institutions in 80+ countries, creating a truly international learning experience.

JGU is ranked Number 1 in the world with the highest overall score amongst all universities and awarded 'Gold' by the Times Higher Education (THE) Online Learning Rankings 2024. JGU has been ranked as India's Number 1 Private University for three years in a row by the prestigious QS World University Rankings 2021-2023. JGU has been recognised among the Top 150 universities globally under the age of 50 years by the QS Young University Rankings. JGU has also been recognised in the Top 500 Universities as per the QS Graduate Employability Rankings 2022.

The Jindal Global Law School, has retained its number one rank in India for six consecutive years and remains the only Indian law school listed in the Global Top 100 by the QS World University Rankings by Subject 2025. Furthermore, JGU holds the distinction of being India's top private university for Arts & Humanities and Politics & International Studies (within the Top 201-250 globally). It ranks among the top two private universities in India for Economics & Econometrics, among the top three private universities in India (Top 274 in the world) for Social Sciences & Management, and among the top six private universities in India for Business & Management Studies (Top 500 in the world) as per the QS World University Rankings by Subject 2025. In 2020, JGU was recognised as an 'Institution of Eminence' by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.





JSIA JINDAL SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA) is India's first global policy School. The School combines the essences of International Relations, International Law and International Business as a necessity of our globalised times because of the density and thickness of international problems. Founded in 2011, the school imparts insights on the latest issues and trends in Global Affairs and International Relations. JSIA, in a short span of ten years, has carved for itself a position of pride of place among world-class entities engaged in the analysis of such themes.

Its journey is facilitated by its diverse Faculty - comprising academics, scholars & researchers, social scientists, authors, practitioner lawyers and diplomats and other eminent experts - drawn from both India and abroad.

The school provides various interdisciplinary undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD programmes to train students in various aspects of International affairs. JSIA has been offering three undergraduate courses- a 3-year Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) Global Affairs since 2015, 3-year Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) Political Science programme since 2020, and a 3-year Bachelor of Arts (Hons.) Diplomacy and Foreign Policy programme since 2022. At Postgraduate level, the school offers a Master of Arts Diplomacy, Law and Business-1 Year and a Master of Arts International Relations, Security and Strategy, and a Ph.D. in International Affairs. From 2023 onwards, all undergraduate programmes are of 4 years.



MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

JSIA's main objective is to generate and spread interdisciplinary social science knowledge that informs current and future international policymaking, via rigorous academic training of qualified graduate students. - The removal of an elective with an (F) grade is possible only after the final semester if the student is fulfilling the mandatory credit requirement of 208 credits.

JSIA'S Outstanding Undergraduate Dissertation Award

The Outstanding Undergraduate Dissertation Award will be granted to a young scholar who will demonstrate exceptional academic prowess by producing a dissertation that makes a highly original and impactful contribution to the field of Diplomacy & Foreign Policy. To be considered for this award, the dissertation must not only present a novel and relevant topic within International Relations but also reflect significant innovation in addressing contemporary global issues, emerging trends, or theoretical developments.

Elective Courses Policy

- BADFP students are offered elective courses from their second semester of study (as an optional course).
- © Elective courses are categorized into:
- General Electives: They are cross elective courses offered by other JGU Schools. These courses are interdisciplinary in nature.
- Specialized Electives: Offered by JSIA (as school elective or cross elective). They are grouped into five main clusters:

- Peace and Conflict Studies
- Economics and Foreign Policy
- Defense and National Security Studies
- Human Rights and International Development
- Global South Studies

Guidelines and Rules for Electives

- Students can take a maximum of 51 credits outside JSIA in case they choose to opt for other school's cross elective which is 25% of the minimum credit requirement for graduation (206 credits).
- External JSIA Credits exceeding 25% will imply the approval of the Dean of the School and Assistant Dean for Academic Affairs for Undergraduate programmes.
- The removal of an elective with an (F) grade is possible only after the final semester if the student is fulfilling the mandatory credit requirement of 206 credits.

JSIA Specialization Policy

JSIA is offering elective courses that are categorized into five clusters:

- 01 Peace and Conflict Studies
- 02 Economics and Foreign Policy
- Defense and National Security Studies
- 04 Human Rights and International Development
- 05 Global South Studies

The student has to pass three electives from the same cluster and undertake a 3 month-internship with one of JSIA research centres associated with a particular cluster to be awarded the specialization certificate before graduation. The three cluster elective courses can be taken in one semester or may be spread over two or more semesters.

Major with Minor Combination

Apart from their major degree, undergraduate students at JSIA can choose from thirteen diverse minor combinations, offering them opportunities to engage in interdisciplinary academic programs that complement their primary field of study. These minors span cognate areas within the humanities, social sciences, international affairs, and public policy, enabling students to tailor their academic experience to match their career aspirations and intellectual interests. This structure empowers students to cultivate a versatile academic profile, making them well-rounded candidates for graduate studies and careers in various sectors, including public service, international relations, research, and private industry.

CURRICULUM

& PFDAGOGY

- All students are required to take 9 mandatory courses covering different fields including international relations, international economics, international law, political and business risk management, academic writing and research methods and international history.
- In addition to the mandatory courses, students may choose from a wide range of elective courses offered by the Schools of International Affairs (JSIA), Global Law School (JGLS), Global Business School (JGBS), Government and Public Policy (JSGP), Liberal Arts & Humanities (JSLH), Journalism & Communication (JSJC), Banking & Finance (JSBF), Design & Architecture (JSDA), Environment & Sustainability (JSES), Psychology & Counselling (JSPC), Languages and Literature (JSLL), and Public Health and Human Development (JSPH).
- In the final quarter, students also have the option of completing a dissertation; the dissertation is worth 8 credits and can be done instead of elective courses of the same credit value.

Students must complete mandatory industry internship after the first two quarters (I, II) during winter break. JSIA has a dedicated team of faculty and staff to assist students with obtaining internships, in both India and abroad, as per student preferences and interests.

The typical format for a class at JSIA is a discussion based seminar on the principle of student-centred teaching. Students are encouraged to engage in critical thinking and lively debate, to draw links between theory, history and current affairs and to become better aware of the relationship between power, politics, business, law and justice.

PROGRAMME MODALITIES

The M.A. (DLB) degree is offered in offline mode: It is full-time, five days a week degree programme. Classes to be held in JGU off-campus centre in New Delhi.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Foreign Language training is an essential requirement for programme and language classes are offered throughout the duration of the programme. Students have the option of choosing from among Spanish, German, French, Mandarin and Japanese.








Study abroad opportunities for undergraduate students*

1. Semester exchange / semester abroad programmes during 5th, 6th or 7th semester of the 4-year BA programmes.

A semester-long experience abroad, in which BA students attend classes in a foreign university and gain academic credits. More than 60 partner universities from various countries collaborate with JSIA, including Argentina, Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Russia, UK, US, and others.

Semester Abroad: Students can go for one or two semesters to the partner university.




SHORT-TERM STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMMES

The short-term study abroad programme with UNITAR (UN Institute for Teaching and Research) is a two-week Summer or Winter school, where students get a first-hand experience in studying multilateral diplomacy, conference diplomacy, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), human rights, international law and justice, within close proximity to UN and other international institutions.

UNITAR's programmes are designed to be very interactive and participatory, which includes a direct exposure to policy practitioners and diplomatic settings, including visits to the Permanent Mission of India to the UN, with sessions including public speaking, negotiation skills, consensus-building, UN resolution writing, guidance on careers and applications.

The UNITAR-JSIA Winter School in Geneva and Summer School in The Hague offer transformative learning experiences for students seeking to understand the workings of the United Nations and its affiliated institutions. These initiatives are designed to deepen participants' knowledge of international affairs, strengthen core diplomatic skills, and provide direct exposure to the institutional landscapes of two of the world's most important cities for global governance.

In Geneva, the Winter School focuses on the city's role as a hub for multilateral diplomacy. Through expert-led lectures, practical training, and immersive sessions, participants explore the structure and functions of the UN system, engage with the foundational values of the UN Charter, and develop competencies essential for careers in international organizations.



Students receive formal training inside the Palais des Nations, engaging directly with the environment where multilateral diplomacy unfolds at the highest level. Sessions are also held at other major institutions, including the World Trade Organization, the World Intellectual Property Organization, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, the World Health Organization, the International Labour Organization, the World Meteorological Organization, and the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights. The programme encourages participants to internalize the principles of the UN Charter and prepares them for future roles in multilateral diplomacy and global governance.

The Summer School in The Hague offers a complementary perspective, emphasizing the city's identity as the City of Peace and Justice. Participants engage with Hague-based institutions through interactive workshops, diplomatic training, and site visits. The programme provides insight into the role of the United Nations in international law and justice, with visits to the International Court of Justice and the International Criminal Court and sessions held by experts at major research and training institutes (The Hague Academy of International Law, Clingendael, Asser Institute, among others). For instance, at Clingendael - formally known as the Netherlands Institute of International Relations and one of Europe's leading think tanks and diplomatic academies - experts delivers highlevel training in diplomacy, negotiation, conflict resolution, and intercultural communication to diplomats, civil servants, and professionals worldwide....and to our students!

To date, more than 100 students from O.P. Jindal Global University, and JSIA more particularly, have taken part in these programmes, gaining firsthand experience in international diplomacy and building networks with professionals and institutions at the forefront of global affairs. Their participation reflects the university's commitment to preparing globally minded leaders equipped to navigate complex international challenges.



TAIWAN FDUCATION CENTRE

Since 2007, Taiwan's Ministry of Education has established Taiwan education centers in many countries through the Taiwan Education Center Plan to attract students to study in Taiwan and promote Chinese teaching. Since 2011, it has fully subsidized the National Tsinghua University to develop the Taiwan Education Center in India and send Chinese teachers. So far, 35 centers have been set up in India—an important stronghold to promote Chinese teaching.

The Taiwan Education Center was established in 2011 at O.P. Jindal Global University. It is a unit under the Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA) and is India's first Taiwan Education Center. The Centre recently celebrated its 13th anniversary.

In addition to learning Mandarin language, the students are very concerned about this forum and participate regularly at the activities organised by this forum.

The 6th India-Taiwan Bilateral Forum on Mandarin Chinese Teaching Materials for Indian Learners was held at 0.P. Jindal Global University on August 9th and 10th, 2024.
