Gaurav Juyal energized students with playful design thinking challenges, while Sweetie Taur invited them to reimagine cities through inclusive,

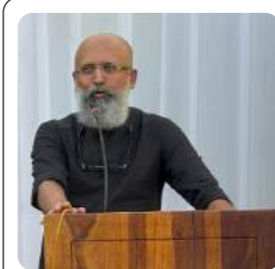


DESIGNING THE **FUTURE** *Together*

“Unfolding the Maker’s Mind”

The Open Studios at JDW 2025 transformed into live laboratories of ideas, energy, and imagination. Over the course of four days, seven diverse professionals invited students into their creative worlds, offering a rare chance to witness design as an evolving process rather than a finished product. These sessions thrived on exploration, collaboration, and the joy of experimentation.

Radhika Gupta unfolded complex systems through the lens of service design, while The Leewardists translated the language of architecture into clever and engaging visual storytelling. Siddhartha Tripathi explored public narratives through the medium of animation, and Gurman Bhatia turned data into stories that were not only clear but deeply human. Mohd Osama dissected political branding, exposing

how campaigns and symbols shape democracy. Adding playfulness, Shradha Jain wove game design into thoughtful practice.

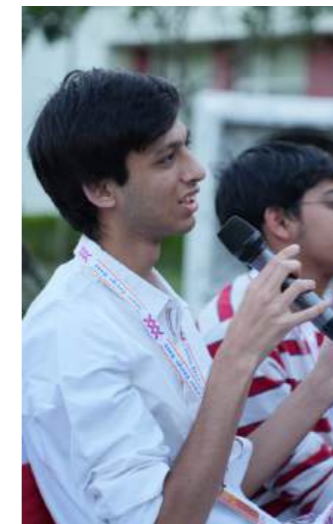

GLOBAL RECOGNITION! *Prof. A Balasubramaniam honoured with Hills Millennium Award*

Balasubramaniam, Founding Director of the Institute of Design at JKLU, has become the first Indian to receive the prestigious Hills Millennium Award 2025, presented by the UK-based Institute of Engineering Designers (IED). Honoured for his lasting contributions to product design, he now joins an elite list that includes Frank Stephenson (Ferrari, McLaren) and Marcus Engman (IKEA). Prof. Bala's career spans iconic designs for Eveready, Eicher, Usha, Hero Motors, and contributions to UNDP and NIIT.

Prof. Amitanshu Shrivastava, faculty at the Institute of Design, JKLU, was recently invited to join the CII Design India Mission to South Korea, recognizing his growing contribution to design education.
